1 Goals 学習目標

Debate and discussion can be challenging, but it's an important communication method used in the real world. By studying this course, you will first build confidence in the basic English communication skills that you already know, and then develop new skills to help you discuss and debate about various topics - simple and complex. Regular communication with teachers and other students will allow you to strengthen your speaking, listening, and thinking abilities.

2 Course Overview 学習概要

- A) You will use all 4 English skills in this course, but you will focus primarily on speaking and listening.
- B) Opinions are the root of all debates and discussions, so you will learn how to share and support your own opinion, as well as understand and refute others' opinions.
- C) In order to express your ideas as accurately as possible, you must use the English skills that you've already learned in other courses, and actively work to improve your knowledge of vocabulary and grammar.

3 Methods of Study 学習方法

(1) In Class

You will work individually, in pairs, or in groups to develop, share, and understand opinions based on various topics. Additionally, each aspect of a debate will be broken down and include discovery, models, language focus, controlled practice, and debate application. You should help create a classroom environment where people are comfortable with challenging themselves.

(2) Studying at Home

While actual discussion, and debate can be done in class, you can still research topics and develop your opinion outside of class time. Furthermore, you should complete any homework assignments and be proactive about looking up or reviewing important words and grammar in order to participate in class.

(3) Improving Your English Skills

This course will provide you with useful phrases and grammar to participate in discussions and debate. However, often times when it comes to explaining and supporting your opinion, you will need to take the initiative to find the best words and ways to express your own original ideas. Hopefully the topics will lead you to learning new English that is relevant to you and your life.
